TAN CLEGHORN AGAIN WOUNDED BY COCHRAN

Fiance of Minnie Marchman and His Brother Shot by Brother-in-law of Dead Girl.

Ashburn, Ga.—Tan Cleghorn, fiance of Miss Minnie Marchman, who strange death created a poison mystery which aroused a sensation throughout this county, was Tuesday afternoon again shot by the dead girl's brother-in-law, W. J. Cochran, who also sent a bullet into Marion Cleghorn, a brother of Tan.

Tan Cleghorn received only a flesh wound, the bullet striking him in the thigh. Marion was hit on the right side of the face, just below the eye. The bullet which traveled toward the ear, has not yet been removed, but

doctors say that the wound is not serious.

Trouble Expected.

Since the previous shooting, last Sunday, of Tan Cleghorn by Cochran, it is asserted, the Cleghorn brothers have been looking for Cochran with loaded revolvers. It was freely predicted that more blood would be spilled as a result of the alleged wrongs done the Marchman girl, and the second outbreak of the feud between the two families Tuesday afternoon was therefore not unexpected.

The shooting occurred when Cochran and Lee Marchman, brother of the dead girl, ran into Tan, Marion and Colie Cleghorn on the streets of Ashburn. All are said to have been armed.

After the affray a warrant was sworn out for Cochran and Marchman by one of the Cleghorn brothers. It was served by Sheriff King, who had already taken the two men into custody. Cochran admitted shooting both the Cleghorn boys.

Released Under Bond.

Both Cochran and Marchman made bond of \$500 each and were promptly released.

When Minnie Marchman died, after severe convulsions, a suspicion arose in the mind of her physician that she had been poisoned. The funeral was arrested and the dead girl's stomach sent to Atlanta for a chemical examination. Suspicion, meanwhile, was directed toward Tan Cleghorn, who

had been very intimate with the girl and who, it was reported, had promised to make her his wife.

COL. FRANK H. CREECH IS DEAD AT BARNWELL

Elko, S. C.—Col. Frank H. Creech, a Confederate veteran and who has been sheriff of Barnwell county for sixteen years, died suddenly at his home in Barnwell Monday just before day. He was at his post in court every day last week, but has been growing feeble for several months. He was a member of the Methodist church in Barnwell and one of its leading members. He leaves a wife and a large family of children, and grandchildren to mourn his loss.
